The petition process is a necessary step to being placed on the primary ballot for the 2024 election, and I appreciate your willingness to help me as I run for Representative in the 63<sup>rd</sup> District. Whether you decide to walk through your neighborhood to get signatures from your neighbors or you only get signatures from members of your household, I am truly grateful for your help.

The process may seem complicated, but it really isn't when you break it down. On the next page you'll see what needs to be done to create a good sheet of petitions. The important thing to remember is that on any sheets you fill out, the signatures must be <u>original</u>. Scanned and emailed petition forms don't count and can't be submitted.

After you've gotten all your signatures, you need to fill out the Circulator's Statement and have your signature notarized. (By the way, you can sign a petition and also fill out the Circulator's Statement.) If you can't find a notary, let me know and I'll arrange to have a notary witness your signature on the statement. If you are able to get a notary, stick the forms in an envelope and mail them back to me at the address above. I'd like to have them back in my hands no later than the first of November.

To circulate a petition, you must be:

- 18 years of age (or will be 18 by the date of the upcoming General Election); and,
- A citizen of the United States (can be from outside of the district, county, or state).

## The circulator must:

- Personally witness all signatures
- Sign the required circulator's statement affirming that all signatures were given in their presence.
- Blank nomination petitions may be reproduced prior to circulation.
- A signer <u>must sign their own signature on the petition</u>, meaning they <u>cannot</u> sign for someone else, such as another member of the family or another person in the household.
- Signers must also be registered voters in the political subdivision in which the candidate is seeking nomination or election.
- Petition signers shall indicate on such petition their residence address (written or printed) including the street address or rural route number, as well as their city, village or town, county, and state.
- A circulator may also sign the petition as an elector.
- The signatures of the signers, circulator, and the notary public must be original.

## **CIRCULATOR'S STATEMENT**

A petition circulator must complete the circulator's statement at the bottom of each petition sheet certifying their address, age, citizenship information, and that the signatures on that sheet were signed in their presence. They must certify that the signatures are genuine and, to the best of their knowledge, that the persons signing were duly registered voters of the political subdivision for which the candidate or candidates shall be nominated, or elected, and that their respective registration addresses are correctly stated therein. This statement shall be sworn to and signed by a notary.

Petition circulators shall indicate on such petition their residence address (written or printed) including the street address or rural route number, as well as the county, city, village or town, and state.

Do <u>NOT</u> number the petition sheet.
