## **Circulator's Instructions**


Any person seeking to run for public office has to prove he or she has enough community support to justify being placed on the ballot. The signatures of voters we collect prove that our candidate is supported by the community. As a circulator, you are fulfilling a critical role in furthering open and robust elections, and I thank you.

### **Campaign Circulator Guidelines:**

- Only one circulator to a sheet. You can't do half and have someone else do half.
- The registered voter must reside in the 63<sup>rd</sup> Legislative District. When in doubt, refer to the attached map or ask the voter to check his/her voter's registration card.
- Circulators must see the registered voter sign the petition.
- Only registered voters can sign a petition. To sign someone else's name is a felony. (Mom can't sign for Dad or grandpa).
- Before leaving the door, ask if there are any other registered voters in the house who'd be willing to sign.
- Signers should sign as they would normally do, printing is acceptable if that's the way the person normally signs his/her name. They should not use initials – they should sign their full name.
- Signers must use the address at which they are currently registered.
- No "ditto" marks
- To circulate a petition in a government building or while working on government time is a misdemeanor.
- If voters want to talk to you for 20 minutes about any particular issue, get their phone number and let them know the campaign will contact them, then politely say goodbye and move on to the next house so you can get what you came for – signatures.
- Stay on sidewalks and driveways; don't walk across lawns.
- If you see a "No Soliciting" sign on the door, go to the next house.
- Prior to being submitted to the campaign, the circulator must fill out the information on the bottom portion of the petition (Circulator's Affidavit). The circulator must sign the Circulator's Affidavit before a notary (required by the Illinois Election Code). Only fill out the bottom of the petitions that you personally circulated and only after you've completed the sheet, even if there's only one signature on the sheet.
- Be legal and be careful.

**Do Not fill in the "SHEET NO. \_\_\_\_\_" at the bottom of the petition page!**
